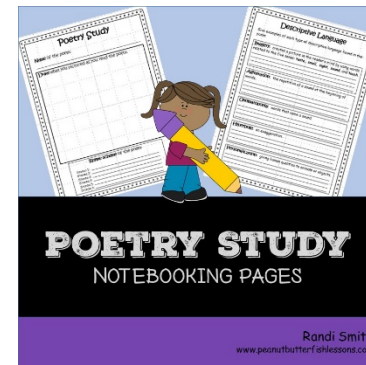

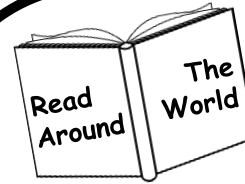

How does location influence the story line?



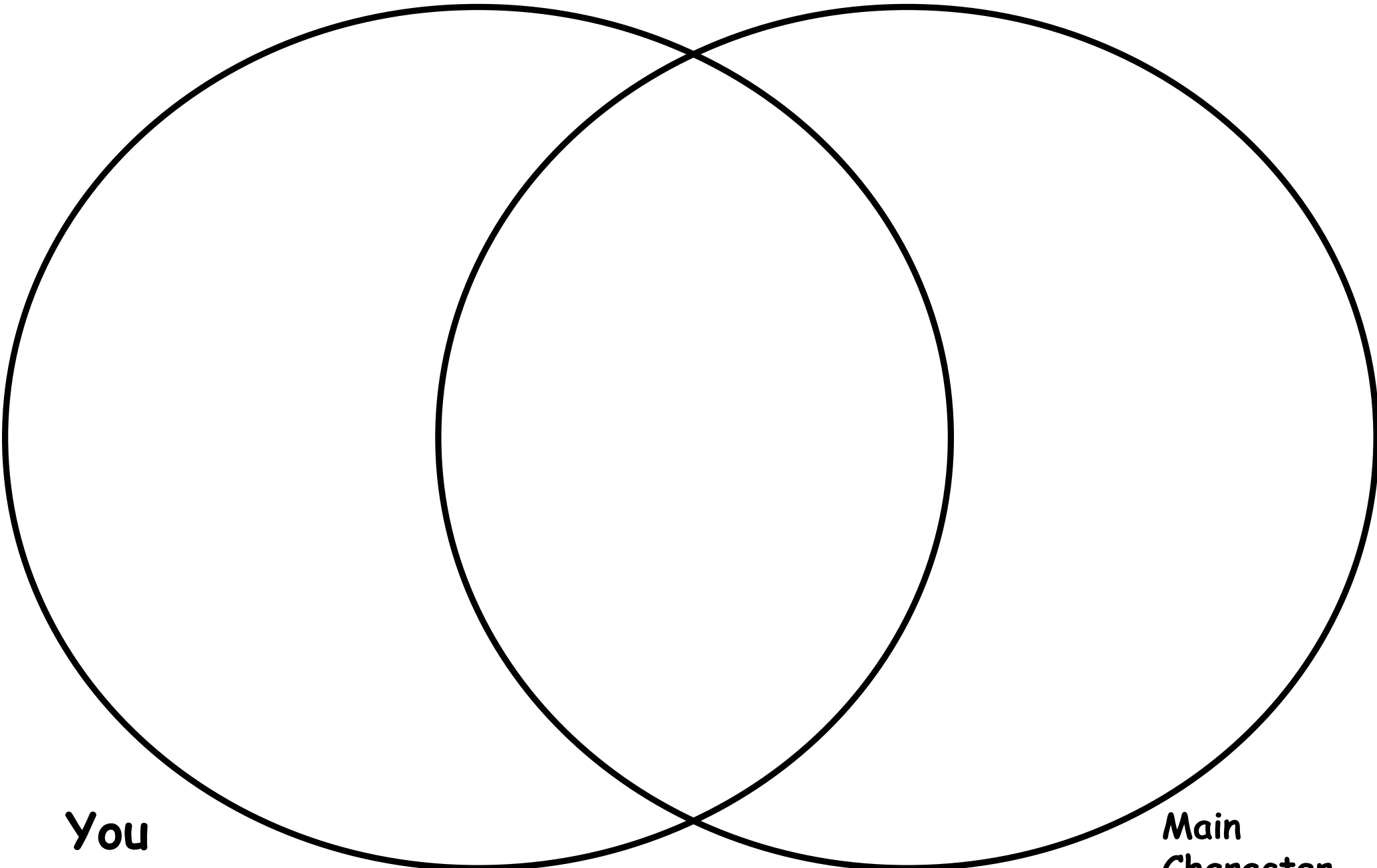
How do cultural traditions and beliefs influence the story line?
